President's Letter:

Changes are afoot in EAGMA! First, and foremost, I would like to thank Steve Harder for serving as president of VAGMA/EAGMA for nine years. He guided the organization through many changes, including changes in venue for the annual show, several mohair pickups, a change in name and scope of the organization, and several website updates. Steve gave selflessly of his time and organized many annual shows, proving again and again how strong and dedicated he was to the success of the group and of the shows. We owe him a great debt of gratitude for all he did as president and wish him the best as he battles pancreatic cancer.

Along with the change in name, I hope that the scope of membership will also change to reflect the Eastern US. To that end, the board has reviewed several possible new sites for the annual show and decided on the Fredrick Fairground, in Fredrick, MD. I wish to thank Greta Dise and Karen Schlossberg for their efforts in researching possible sites and continued efforts to organize this year's show. The new location is more central for our northern members and easy access to I-70 for those to the west. It also provides for several metropolitan centers, so we can increase visitation to the show and vending possibilities. The show will be on Saturday 26 and Sunday 27 June. Show participants will be able to pen their goats and set up vending booths on Friday afternoon, but there are no scheduled activities that day. Our show will host the national CAGBA show as part of the colored Angora goat show on Sunday. Thanks to Colleen Reed for negotiating the agreement with CAGBA. It will be an exciting year with new possibilities.

The board is working to develop a schedule for nomination, elections, and office term. I hope to establish a regular schedule and rotation of elections and solicit wider participation. We need to reach out to members in all parts of the region to participate on the board, so the needs of all members are represented. This will require creative planning to affect productive board meetings but is necessary if the organization is to truly be Eastern.

I encourage you to visit the new website. Lisa Check and Karen Schlossberg have spent a lot of time on the redesign to improve the functionality of the site for our members. They are working hard to complete the various pages on the site, which is a work in progress. The details of the annual show will be available soon, including possibilities for lodging at the show.

November Board Meeting Minutes

Meeting Convened at 11:15 a.m., at Avalon Springs Farm, Maryland. **Members Present:** John F., Pat and Steve H., Mindy S., Pat K., Adrienne H.B., Leslie O., Greta D., and Karen S. **Members Absent:** Colleen R., Lisa C.

Meeting called to order by John F:

Approval of the Minutes from the last meeting:
Motion made by Adrienne, 2nd by Pat K. and passed unanimously.

Treasurers Report by Adrienne:

Account balance is \$615.25.
Still owe the Harders \$300; now owe John Frett \$250 for deposit to the Frederick Fairgrounds.
All agreed that the account is too low. It was agreed that we would cease sending \$ to other institutions until such time as our account was in better position. It was noted that no other non-profits are members of EAGMA. Adrienne made this a motion, Karen 2nd. Motion passed unanimously.

Membership Coordinators Report by Adrienne:

50 paid members; 1 new member has just come in.
Read list of inactive members to the board to see if there were any recognizable names that people could encourage friends to keep membership active.

Membership Drive Report by Greta and Karen:

Greta's invitation to EAGMA letter was sent out by Colleen via e-mail. The e-mail included the letter, an old newsletter, and the membership form to join.
A few names bounced back. One new member has joined from this campaign so far.

Other Business:

John presented the email that was sent in by Becky Salinger regarding EAGMA's participation in an inter-show point system for goat ranking. It was discussed by the group. The concern is that the population going to multiple shows is very small. John agreed to continue dialogue with Becky S.

2010 Show Discussion

Vendors Fees: Greta did research on the average price of fees and looked at many shows across the country. Average price was about \$50 or a bit more for an established show or show with a heavy traffic. John made a motion to have Vendor fees set at \$50 for this year's show. Leslie 2nd. Motion passed unanimously.

Vendors Attendance: Steve made a motion that: A. the number of fiber vendors be a maximum of 12 this year until a traffic pattern/amount is established/analyzed. B. the previous vendors, then EAGMA members, then CAGBA members are given preference in filling those slots along with some order of contact. If there are unfilled slots, the Board will do some collective jurying. Mindy 2nd. Motion passed unanimously.

Sponsorships: Sponsorships will be \$50 again this year. \$15 will be awarded for 1st place, \$10 will be awarded for 2nd place, \$5 will be awarded for 3rd place. After the 2010 show, if our finances are not in a better situation we will consider dropping monetary prizes for the 2011 show.

Event Schedule: There was a discussion regarding events scheduled on Friday and the lower attendance thereof. Traditionally there has only been one track/line of events. This year there will be a need for some multiple lines of scheduled events, especially if we are avoiding Friday scheduling.

Event Contents: Greta is in discussion with Susan Schoenian (MD extension office agent) to have her participate as a lecturer. Karen is speaking with a shearer/toe-trimmer. By consensus action (acclaim?), Phylleri will be invited back for more classes.

Judge: John will be making phone calls shortly for judge invitation.

Hay/Straw: Karen will make the arrangements for a vendor to have hay/straw at the show.

Raffle: Steve H. will continue to do a Raffle. He will secure the items to do the raffle.

Insurance: Karen presented research done on securing show insurance; preliminary bid of \$370. It was agreed that Karen and John would continue to look for a better price.

BOARD MEMBERS & BALLOT QUESTIONS

In the July (August) edition of the newsletter, the EAGMA members were solicited for their nominations and opinions on the following topics: EAGMA President, EAGMA Board Members, and an official Shearing Date cutoff for the show.

The issue of hair length has been a perennial debate. In order to establish a member-based requirement, we

are putting a single cut-off date for the show up to the members for a vote. The question is either yes or no that all goats entered in the show must be sheared after January 1st of the year of that show.

Montana: A 23-year-old Angora goat named Angel died at the aptly-named Beartooth Nature Center in Red Lodge, MT on October 2nd when a black bear

dug under the fence and attacked the goat. Angel came to Beartooth back when it was a petting zoo rather than a wildlife rehabilitation center and sanctuary, and stayed during the conversion. You can see a video about her here:

International News

Australia: The export-focused mohair goat sector is enjoying a 30 per cent boost in prices for the natural fiber, which is being used in a trial of large-scale, commercial domestic processing.

Australian yarn and cloth manufacturers are showing strong interest in the eight-ton early stage mohair processing trial that's produced the 'tops'

they've previously had to re-import to manufacture luxury Australian clothing.

The Australian Mohair Marketing Organizations chairman Keith Cowan says the mohair was processed at Bacchus Marsh in Victoria, and is finding a ready market with manufacturers catering for a growth market in natural fiber blends.

"There is quite a drive at the moment into these natural fibers at the moment, whether it be wool or alpaca or mohair," he says. "The companies out there are prepared to use it and the consumer is really looking for rare natural fibers."

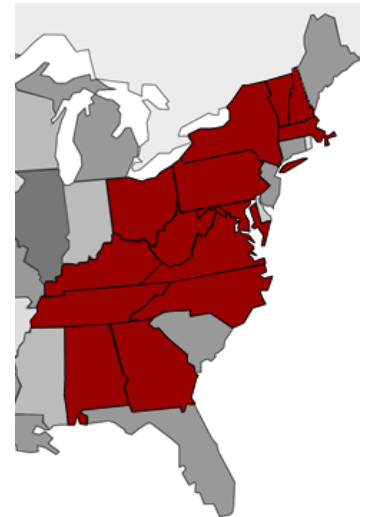
